From the desk of Pastor Jonathan

"The Lord Remembers"

... and the Lord remembered Hannah. In due time she conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, "I have asked him of the Lord." (1 Sam. 1:19-20)

Dear Friends,

As most of you are already aware, Jessica and I are looking forward to welcoming a new person into the world this month. Our son will be born sometime around October 18th and will usher us into a whole new chapter of life. This gift has been long awaited and our child will forever remain a living, breathing answer to prayer.

Now, what does it mean that some prayers are answered and others are not? This is a deep mystery, but whether the deep desires of our hearts are fulfilled or not, God acknowledges all our yearning with the promise of eternal and flourishing life. We must look for this signs of this promise coming true in the midst of our grief and uncertainty. After a miscarriage in 2016, Jessica and I were unsure we would be able to have children. And we did not demand this from God; we did not put God to the test. Simply, we hoped, we waited, and we tried to answer God's call in our lives. My testimony is that God gave me the strength for the long periods of sadness and uncertainty in my life. This strength has come in the form of small signs along the way that I am not alone, and that God's love and salvation are, in the end, the only things that truly satisfy. Like Hannah, I have realized that my deepest longing is to be united with One who "knit me in my mother's womb," who "knows the number of the hairs on my head." Like Hannah, we will dedicate our son to the Lord, "in whom we live and move and have our being." In the end, we will turn over to God the gift we desired most to possess. For this droplet of time that we call life is awash in the ocean of God's eternity! What is 60 or 90 or 100 trips around the Sun in the unending life of the Holy Trinity? In the end, it will feel to us who wait upon the Lord as if all our prayers have been answered in a twinkling. In the end, we will fully know that God has not forgotten us... we will know that the Lord remembers all the promises made to humankind. In the end, we will be with Jesus, the lover of our souls; we will belong to him and he to us, and all of life will be a living, breathing answer to prayer.

Jessica and I look forward to sharing the joy of our baby boy with this church family. He is not given so we can feel fulfilled in our lives. He is given so that God's glory may be known among us. May his coming be a sign for everyone that the Lord is God, and that God is with us. And may each of you see and tell the signs of God's faithfulness in your lives. Meanwhile, if any are waiting for answers to prayer, let us encourage one another in the hope of God's salvation. "Thanks be to God, who has given us the victory through our Lord, Jesus Christ."

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

With the beginning of October, our thoughts turn to the holidays ahead. Samaritan's Purse last year distributed 11,486,773 shoe boxes to children in 104 countries. (9,122,910 came from the United States with the other 2,363,863 from Canada, United Kingdom, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Finland, Spain, Australia, New Zealand, and Japan.)

Many times this is the first gift a child has ever received.

Here at First, our UMW is collecting items and filling shoe boxes, or you can take a shoe box and a brochure that explains what can and cannot be sent, and fill it yourself.

Samaritan's Purse volunteers deliver the shoe boxes along with biblical literature in the languages the children understand in each country. Then they follow up with classes for the children to learn about Jesus, and many of them accept Him as their personal Savior.

This is a very worthwhile mission, and we are excited to take part in it.

Please join us by filling a shoe box and, or helping with the shipping and handling cost of \$9.00 per box. They must be returned to the church no later than November 12th.

Let's help make this a very Merry and Meaningful Christmas for God's children all over the world.
