

Trustee News

We will be replacing the carpet in the Office starting on May 6, 2024 which is a Monday. The install time will be approximately 3 days. During this time we will be limited as to what we will be able to do in the office. Please have patience. We will be clearing out anything moveable from the office starting on Saturday May 4. Any and all help will be appreciated. We will be starting sometime around 9:30 a.m.

A plumbing company has been contracted to take care of several plumbing issues which have came up. This will replace some broken stools, and make the restrooms come up closer to being ADA compliant. This will also fix leaks in the kitchen, take care of the sink and drain in the café, and several other problems.

Lighting is being worked on and will be completed in within the next few weeks. By fixing and replacing lights especially in the kitchen area, we should cut down considerably on the electrical usage. We pay over \$1,000 per month to Consumers Energy for lights and heat.

The parapet over the south doors has pieces of cement breaking loose and falling in places where someone could be injured. This is going to be repaired when the roof is fixed.

If you see anything which needs attention please let someone know. We are doing our best to repair and replace needed items, but sometimes over look the small stuff.

Trustee meetings are on the First Wednesday of the month at 10:00 a.m. Everyone is invited. April's Meeting is the 3rd.
