From the desk of Pastor Jon

What Have You Done in Your Faith Life That Scares You?

I recently had an email exchange with someone who mentioned something that I had once told them about faith. Namely, it's scary. A lot of the time, taking a step of faith moves us out of our comfort zone until we are completely comfortable trusting in God. I told her, if there isn't fear involved, we're probably just trusting in our own abilities and wisdom. If we're afraid (and we do it anyway) God might be in there somewhere.

My question for you to meditate on is simply this:

"What have you done in your faith life that scares you?"

The Apostle Paul tells us that we live by faith, not by sight (2 Cor. 5:7) as we anticipate being with God forever. We want to be with God, but for this life, we live with temptation and struggles of many kinds. Those can be scary and sometimes doing the right thing is scary too. Sometimes, following God's call on our lives seems like it might not be the right choice. Yet, as people of faith, we're called to move in the ways that God leads.

My challenge for you this month is to lean into your discomfort. Maybe you're uncomfortable tithing. Maybe you're uncomfortable sharing your faith and what God has done for you. Maybe you're uncomfortable reading the Bible. Maybe you're uncomfortable with prayer. Maybe you're uncomfortable surrendering a secret sin. I don't know what it is for you, but I don't have to know. You know. God knows. So, follow God in the next step that you're being led.

Sometimes people come ready to make major changes in their lives and want to know what God's will is for them. The baseline answer to their question is holiness. God wants us to, by faith, be more like God. The most distilled version of this is loving God with all our heart, soul and strength and loving our neighbors as ourselves.

So lean into that, even if it makes us a little scared. Trust that God will hold us in his hands when things are uncertain. Trust that God loves us.

Women My morning devotional shared the thought that we should all become more aware of the Many blessings that surround us. Then we should give thanks for all the gifts and blessings bestowed upon us. We should also pray we all can find joy and satisfaction in every amazing moment. It brought to mind a statement Don made earlier this week. His therapist asked him if he were depressed. Without hesitation, he replied "No, no! There are many people in worse condition than I am." Then I thought about the nurses and how they cope with all their patients, some just not "happy campers" and others so weak or ill that they don't respond to much of anything. It has been amazing to witness Don maintaining his sense of humor, and actually giving the nurses an opportunity to smile and laugh.

As your UMW board prepares for the coming year, it is one of our goals to bring joy and laughter into the lives of others who really have little to be joyful about. One of the upcoming projects will be to create Health Kits. These kits are composed of necessities for people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disasters. The health kits are also used as learning tools in personal hygiene, literacy, nutrition and cooking classes.

So that you may be able to take advantage of sales, the following is a list of items we will be collecting. Each kit will contain:

1 hand towel, 15 x 25 inches to 17 x 27 inches. Kitchen, cleaning and microfiber towels are not acceptable. **1 washcloth**

1 comb It needs to be sturdy and longer than 6 inches. Pocket combs and picks are not acceptable. Rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable if there is 6 inches of teeth.

1 metal nail file or clippers. Emery boards are not acceptable.

1 Bath-size bar of soap, 3 oz. and large size only. No Ivory or Jergens because of moisture content. Do not remove from original packaging.

1 adult size toothbrush. Do not remove from original packaging.

6 adhesive bandages, 1/4 to 1 inch size. Common household Band-Aids.

1 plastic bag. One-gallon size, sealable bag.

One dollar for toothpaste.

All items must be new. Do not wash any items because they will be considered used. These emergency kits are carefully planned to make them useable in the greatest number of situations. Due to the fact that strict rules often govern product entry into international countries. It is important that kits contain only the requested items, nothing more.

Our schedule for collecting the items and sending them to UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) will BE DETERMINED AT OUR February meeting. Watch the bulletin board and bulletins for further information.
