From the desk of Pastor Jon

The new year is underway and at Ionia First UMC, we're reminded of our mission: To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of Ionia. As we remember this, let's take a moment to take it to heart.

Making disciples of Jesus Christ first means being a disciple of Jesus Christ. In other words, we are the first disciple we should concentrate on making. None of us can give away that which we do not first possess. Therefore, I must ask you in this new season to redouble your devotion to prayer, scripture and loving others. No one will care about what we know until they know that we care.

The danger in this moment is that many people get stuck in that first step. Whole churches have gotten stalled in their desire to make sure that they are a good enough Christian before they encourage someone else in their a walk of faith. Yet, at some point, often a point sooner than we might expect, we need to stop looking inward and recognize the opportunities that God is giving us. Please prayerfully consider how God is calling you to walk with someone else in your faith journey.

Another danger about faith sharing is that some people get caught up in the mouth vs. hands debate. If you've never heard of this it goes something like: I like to live out my faith and don't need to say anything about it or I will talk to people about what I believe and leave serving to others. It's natural to want to swerve toward either acting or speaking for many people, but we all are called to be ready to do both when the chance presents itself.

Lastly, the second half of our mission statement is about transforming Ionia. If our lives of faith are not making change, then we need to re-evaluate our how we are living that life out. This year I have opportunities to be part of a grief group (just started!), a parenting group (look for it this summer) and maybe a financial group (this fall? We'll see). My hope is that lives can be changed. But, I can't do it alone.

How can our walk of faith impact our community? What is it that our community needs? What can faith say to people who live without faith? What comfort can we bring? What wisdom can we offer?

Please prayerfully consider these questions about how we can reach out and lets start a conversation.

Plans for February are more international and we will be working on a project to benefit SMILE.




