Our Guide on the Way

Show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long. Psalm 25:4-5

According to the New York Department of Environmental Conservation there are about 200 people every year that have to be found because they get lost in the woods. 200 people park their cars, start off on a trail and somehow manage to not find their way back. 200 families get worried for their safety and 200 calls to action are sent out to the DECs rangers to drop what they are doing and go find those people.

Part of the reason people get lost is they go into the unknown unprepared. Whether they are not ready for an emergency or simply do not understand how to read a map. So many people share the misconception that nothing bad can happen to them and when it does they are helpless.

A guide would probably have helped them. A guide would never have allowed those lost folks to set out without first aid kits, proper attire or a good map. A guide would have been with them every step of the way and kept them from the trails they had no business being on.

So it is with our spiritual walk. Declaring myself to be a Christian does not make me a master of spirituality any more than a new pair of hiking boots makes me ready to tackle the Appalachian Trail. In the verses from the Psalm above we read a cry to God to be the guide. The author clearly understands his inadequacies for the trail and the trial ahead of him. Thus he calls out to the One who clearly understands the path and has the power to lead him through.

Today, and perhaps for days to come, I would encourage you to spend some time with the scripture above. It's a simple two lines long and most of us can memorize it in minutes. It would be easy to write it down and set it where you will see it on a regular basis. Take some time and pray those words. Can you pray them with the same level of passion that the author wrote them? Can you ingrain them not only into your mind, but also into your soul?

May it be that we the people of Ionia First UMC will rely on God to be our guide and place our hope in Him all day long.




